

# INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON RECYCLING NETWORKS & WASTE GOVERNANCE



*Theme: Sustainable Waste Collection and Recycling for Inclusive Cities*

Inspired by the urge of cities to transform their waste management into a more sustainable and inclusive system the main theme of the conference is Sustainable Waste Collection and Recycling for Inclusive Cities. Research results from six countries will highlight initiatives and grassroots social innovations promoting environmentally and commercially sound waste disposal and resource recovery. The conference is followed by 5 days of workshops, training sessions and field visits among the research team to discuss sub-themes as innovative waste collection and recycling models, solid waste management and governance, role of local government in waste management, sustainability of waste picker organizations, bottom-up circular economy models, grassroots innovations and practical lessons or success stories across various cities in different countries.

The events will involve the research team, local government, waste pickers, networks, intermediaries and other key actors and other interested participants. The conference will entail presentations and demonstrations of various models of sustainable and inclusive waste management by the following project partners:
