The Department of Physiology, Institute of Neuroscience and Physiology, hereby announces a vacant scholarship at undergraduate/advanced level in metabolism.

Training plan

Subject: Metabolism with focus on adipose tissue biology

Background: I would like to give curious students hands-on experience from research within the area of metabolism.

Purpose: The student will receive practical and theoretical training within the areas of metabolism and research methodology.

Method: The student will assist a more experienced researcher (typically a postdoc) in his/her research. Thereafter, the student will gradually perform own experiments under the supervision of myself or another team member. Theoretical training will be given via informal interactions in person and/or email, and planned group meetings. The student will also be given opportunity to present own data.

Learning outcome: The student should have learnt how to design a scientific experiment, follow basic lab protocols, be able to discuss and present results as well as understand basic concepts within the area of metabolism.
