

RESEARCH STUDY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF GOTHENBURG



WANTED RESEARCH PARTICIPANTS

Have you reported a rape to the police and/or sought medical care after being raped? Do you want to answer a questionnaire about your experiences?

Researchers at the University of Gothenburg are currently recruiting women who have been raped and who has reported it to Police and/or sought medical care after being raped. The Swedish Crime Victim Support and Compensation Authority funds the project, and the Regional Ethical Review Board in Gothenburg has ethically approved it.

The aim of the study is to gain knowledge about how women who have been raped experience their initial contacts with police and/or medical personnel.

The focus of the questions are your experiences of meeting with police and/or medical personnel, and not the experiences that led up to reporting/seeking care. You do not have to have

the experience of meeting with both police and medical personnel – you can answer the questionnaire based on your specific experiences. It is voluntary to participate in this study, and you have the right to withdraw your participation at any time without having to explain why. It takes approximately 30 minutes to answer the questionnaire.

The questionnaire is anonymous, and no specific answers can be connected to you in person. The material will be handled in such a way that no one unauthorized has access to it. All written reports will be descriptions on group level.

The lead researcher and project leader is Lisa Rudolfsson, doctor of psychology.

We are looking for women, 18 years or older, who has filed a police report on rape and/or sought medical care after being raped. We want to know your experiences.
