

## **Call for Proposals**

With the purpose to share knowledge and make connections, QRM encourages doctoral students and researchers to present their ongoing research. We invite proposals for individual papers and posters at the QRM conference. The submissions can address a large variety of educational research questions using quantitative research methods relevant to e.g., national or international large-scale assessments, as well as matters of social recruitment, segregation and inequality throughout the educational system. We also welcome submissions that target methodological considerations and challenges.

#### **Submission requirements**

• **Poster proposals** should include a title, an abstract of 250 words maximum, and up to five keywords. The size of the poster should be 78 cm (width) x 119 cm (height) maximum.

Submit your poster abstract via <u>the poster submission form</u> no later than April 16.

• **Paper proposals** should include a title, an abstract of 400 words maximum, and up to five keywords. The abstract should contain an introduction to the proposal, the main aim(s), methods, findings and key conclusion(s).
