However, the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) offer a clear global roadmap, encouraging all stakeholders to actively engage in this transformation. Key players in government and industry are beginning to respond to this call. A notable example is the European Green Deal, an ambitious package of policy initiatives

adopted by the Member States of the European Union, which aims to set the EU on a path toward climate neutrality by 2050.
