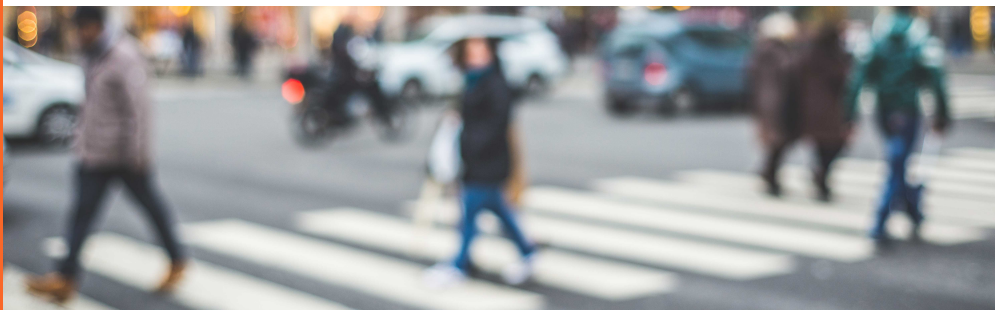


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Hello

Apply for funding from Nordic funds

Nordic LGBTI Fund opens for applications 1 September

NIKK, Nordic Information on Gender, is a cooperation body under the Nordic Council of Ministers, based at the Swedish Secretariat for Gender Research. Every year, NIKK distributes funds to promote Nordic cooperation and the rights of LGBTI people. Funding can be applied for projects in which at least three organisations from at least three Nordic countries are collaborating. The fund opens for applications on 1 September, and there will be an opportunity to ask questions during a digital call on 9 September.

Nordic Gender Fund opens for applications 1 October

The call for applications for the Nordic Gender Fund 2025 will open this autumn. The Nordic Gender Fund accepts applications for infrastructure support within a broad interdisciplinary field. The Fund contributes to activities aimed at starting up or strengthening 1) scientific networks, 2) the organisation of scientific conferences, and 3) scientific journals. This year's call for applications is open between 1 October and 1 November.
