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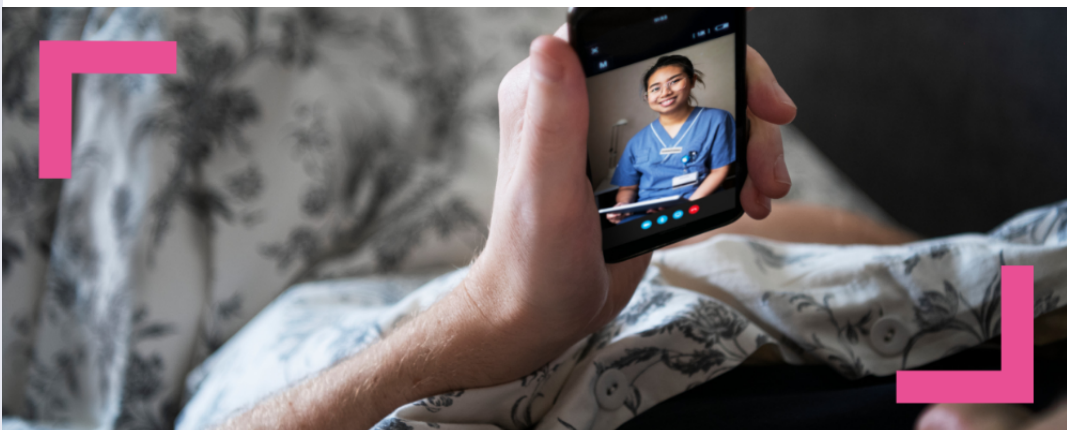
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Hello

Research provides new perspectives on the resilience of welfare

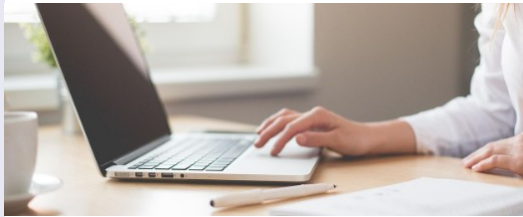
How can Nordic welfare become stronger in the face of future crises? A new publication shows how gender perspectives can contribute to



increased resilience in health and social care. Four research essays highlight key challenges and possible ways forward.

In the publication *The resilience of welfare in crises in the Nordic region, a gender perspective on challenges and ways forward in healthcare*, researchers in global public health, economic history, demography, sociology and social work contribute reflections and problematisations in four essays.
