

Two to three scholarships for research into entrepreneurship and innovation

TWO TO THREE SCHOLARSHIPS OF SEK 200 000 EACH FOR RESEARCH INTO ENTREPRENEURSHIP

The postdoc scholarship holders must have completed their doctorates (or equivalent) within a field relevant to business, innovation and entrepreneurship. Applicants focusing on entrepreneurship and innovation are particularly encouraged, as are applicants in the fields of innovation, entrepreneurship and university-industry relationships.

This research shall start during 2014, with the School of Business, Economics and Law as their base and environment. The scholarship holders will be expected to present their research in connection with various events at the School of Business, Economics and Law, and also to participate in various networks in respect of research into entrepreneurship both in Sweden and abroad.

These scholarships will, primarily, be granted to younger researchers who have recently completed their doctorates (within three years). Postdocs can send in their application before completing the thesis, but they must have completed their PhD degree and start the research in 2014.

For younger researchers who receive scholarships from *Bromanska stiftelsen*, an evaluation of their research and research activities will take place after about eight months of full time research. If the researcher is also employed at the School, then the stipendium can be used for travel and subsistence costs that are directly linked to the research project.

The Broman selection committee may also consider applications from senior researchers employed at the School of Business, Economics and Law, but maximum 1 stipendium might be granted. For senior researchers the grant should be used primarily for travel and subsistence costs in connection with research activities abroad. Applications from senior researchers shall include a supporting letter from the head of the department. Applications should be addressed to *Bromanska stiftelsen för forskning och företagande* and sent to Faculty Administration Office at the School of Business, Economics and Law, Box 601, SE-405 30 Gothenburg, Sweden. The applications must include a brief outline of the planned research project (max 5 pages) in addition to the usual qualification documents (Personal letter, CV, Transcripts, and, for younger researchers also 2 letters of recommendation).

Applications must be received by us by Friday, **10 October 2014 at the latest**. Bromanska stiftelsen för forskning och företagande plans to make its decision on recipients in October-November 2014.

According to the Statutes of Bromanska stiftelsen för forskning och företagande, it is possible for holders of this scholarship to receive it on a maximum of three occasions.
