ACADEMIC MERITS

RESEARCH PROGRAMME

The research programme is focused on person-centred palliative care, responding to societal challenges for the provision of care and support to people living at the end-of-life and dying, and their families (as defined by the person) involved before and following loss.¹

Research programme structure Initially, I developed a person-centred palliative care research programme with focus on experiential and existential outcomes of palliative care. Following my postdoctoral period, I developed it to focus on person-centred communication aiming at timely communication of end-of-life issues. Then, I developed and re-structured it into focusing on facilitating home as place of care at the end of life and dying with two interrelated areas: place of care at the end of life and dying, and support to families enabling care at home and their own wellbeing before and following loss. In these two areas, experiential and existential outcomes of palliative care for patients and families as well as person-centred communication for timely communication of end-of-life issues are integrated and regarded as means rather than end-points, which was more of the case in my early career.

Methodological development has been integrated as parts throughout in my research, mainly focused on phenomenological and hermeneutical practices and more recently, also including development and validation of measurement scales.

Teaching materials production

Teaching materials and popularized texts are related to five major areas (i-v):

- i. Generic nursing is focused in these books and reports:
 - The first *Nursing Foundations* targeted for Swedish Nursing Undergraduate Education, three volumes. As part of an editorial team comprising six scholars, I was co-principal editor with Dr. Febe Friberg for one volume who took the initiative to develop a nursing foundation text resource for the Swedish nursing programmes. One starting point was issues raised as part of the Swedish Higher Education Review 2006 in which I and colleagues who served as expert reviewers became aware that nursing students seldom knew of any nursing research conducted in Sweden, and in particular, no research from the specific university they studied at. We undertook the project to develop a nursing foundation textbook building upon international research evidence and especially including reference to relevant and significant Swedish nursing research. A basic assumption for the textbooks is that nursing may not be unequivocally be defined. However, different standpoints from where nursing can be “viewed”, studied and problematized can be created through illuminating nursing out of various complementary perspectives and types of knowledge. The three volumes focus on different perspectives, with chapters written by 100 experts, and are labelled: *Perspectives and approaches* (Eds. Friberg F & Öhlén J), *Health and illness* (Eds. Edberg A-K & Wijk H) and *Accountability and development* (Eds. Ehrenberg A & Wallin P). Since their launch in 2009, the three volumes have been

used in almost every Swedish undergraduate nursing programme, and the second revised editions were published in 2014. Student evaluations have been very positive, as have teacher evaluation.

- A special edited volume of the *Nursing Foundations* (above) for clinical nurses was compiled with selected chapters from all three volumes and launched in 2010 in cooperation with the Swedish Society of Nursing.
 - Complementary to the Nursing Foundations volumes, the whole editorial team continued with the development of a textbook on *generic nursing for master's and specialist nursing education*. The book is novel in the way it presents generic nursing knowledge structured on the generic core competences for health care professionals: person-centred care, interdisciplinary team collaboration, employing evidence based practice, applying quality improvement, sustaining safety in health care and utilizing informatics. Further, the six generic nursing chapters are complemented by 100 unique nursing-specific articles to be retrieved electronically from the book's virtual platform. The book thus consists not only of 260 pages, but close to 600 pages in total. It is included as required reading in several specialist nursing programmes in Sweden.
 - *Nursing as an academic subject*. This is popularized in a series of reports initiated by the Swedish Society of Nursing, and in which I have been involved as an expert. An overall purpose is to contribute to the discussion of nursing as the subject at different levels. The target group of the reports is clinicians as well as teachers and researchers. I have been involved in project groups with co-responsibility for editing and writing reports (in total 3) regarding nursing as the main subject, basic research in nursing and experienced-based knowledge as well as part of teams in charge of writing chapters with commentaries in relation to needs of family members in palliative care nursing, patient teaching and patient learning, the main subject in Swedish nursing and specialist nursing programmes after the Bologna reform.
- ii My doctoral thesis into *narratives about alleviation of suffering* was published by the book company Nya Doxa following my defence and has been used as required readings on several palliative courses at Swedish universities as well as in continuing education.
- iii Popularized publications of palliative care was the main purpose of the web pages "*The Thematic Room of Palliative Care*" as part of a bouquet of thematic web pages presenting popularized health care research by the former Vårdalinstitutet, run by the Universities in Gothenburg and Lund in collaboration. Over a seven-year period I was responsible for this development together with Magdalena Andersson, Eslöv municipality and Lund University; mostly editorial responsibility.
- iv *Palliative care* is the subject in three book chapters:
- A popularized volume on a health-promoting perspective of palliative care "*Whilst we still are living – about the life close to death*".
 - A chapter on palliative care focusing *different perspectives on palliative care, the needs for palliative care in the population and different approaches to palliative care practice* is included in one of the volumes of the Nursing Foundations.
 - *Perspectives on suffering* based on the ethical intention by Paul Ricoeur are my contribution to an edited volume of Swedish palliative care research.
- v *Research methods* is the subject of four book chapters and a result of my methodological research: Phenomenological and hermeneutic approaches, a lifeworld phenomenological research approach and Narrative research methods.

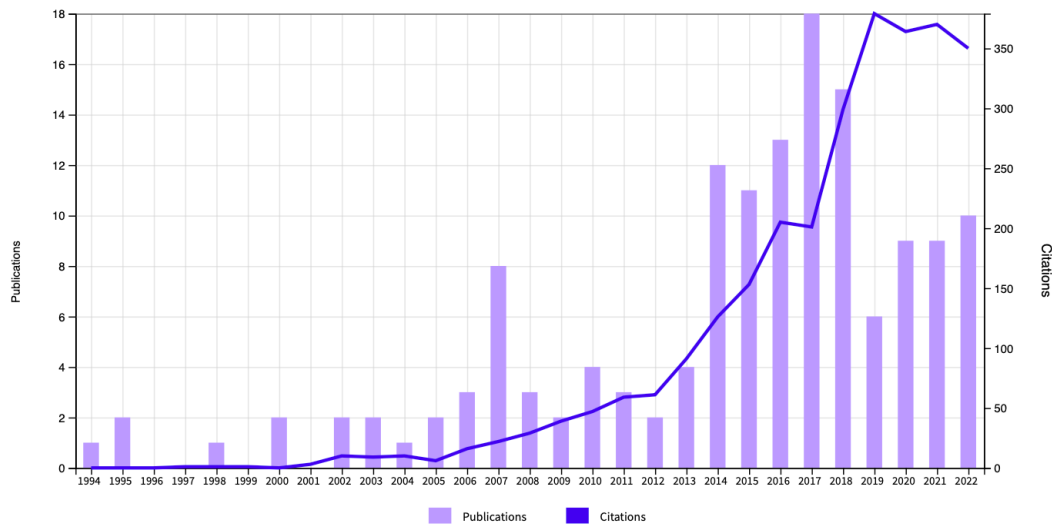

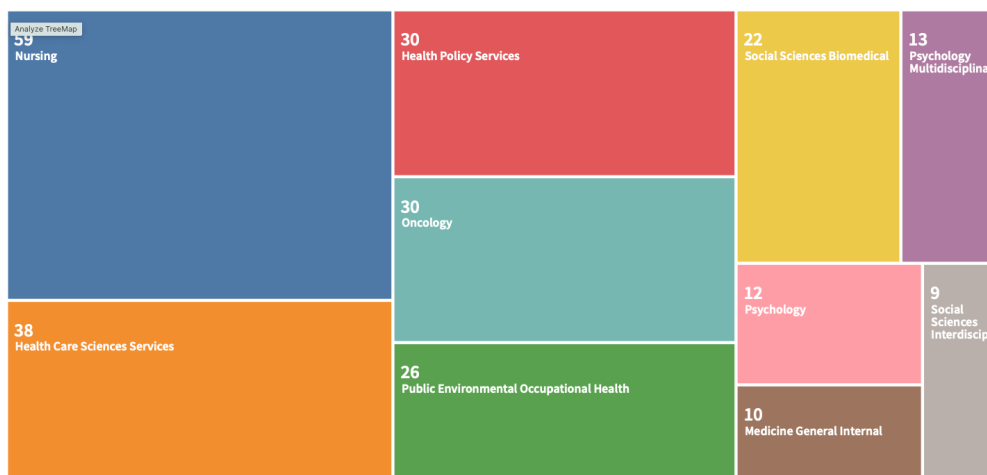
